With reference to your letter cited above, it is submitted that we have noted the suggestions made and the college authorities will strive to implement all the above in letter and spirit. We also take the opportunity to intimate the following affirmative actions that have been in force in this institution:

- 1. The students seeking admission into this college are informed about the ill-effects and consequences of ragging such as cancellation of admission, suspension from the classes, debarring from examinations etc. right at the time of admission. **Undertaking** to this effect from the students is taken before admitting them into the college. The admission form is enclosed, indicates the undertaking from the student.
- Wide publicity is given by displaying posters prepared by the college as well as those issued by the State Police Department in the college campus prominently. A sample of such posters is enclosed.
- 3. Strict surveillance is maintained in all places vulnerable to ragging such as college campus, canteen, bus stops etc. by posting anti-ragging squads comprising of staff and students. Regular meetings of Anti-ragging squads are conducted involving concerned C.I & S.I of Police to review the situation and take corrective measures immediately. The list of anti-ragging squads are enclosed.
- 4. Extended **counseling sessions** are held by the faculty at various periodicities to highlight the ill effects of ragging.
- 5. The **lunch timings are staggered** and the **first year classes** are held in a **separate building** to insulate them from the seniors during the first year.
- The college authorities are highly conscious of the repercussions and leaves no leaf unturned to curb the menace. In this regard it does not hesitate in seeking cooperation from the police department when necessary.
